

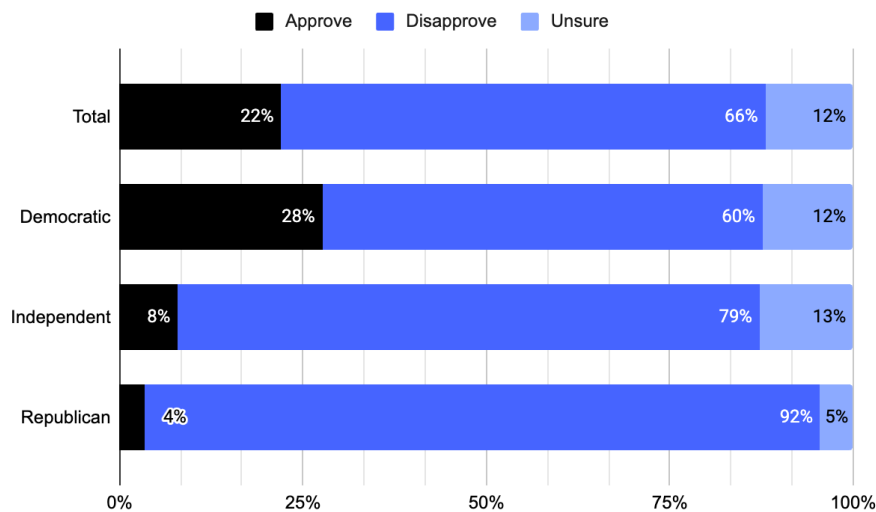


Katie Wilson - Seattle Registered Voter Poll Topline

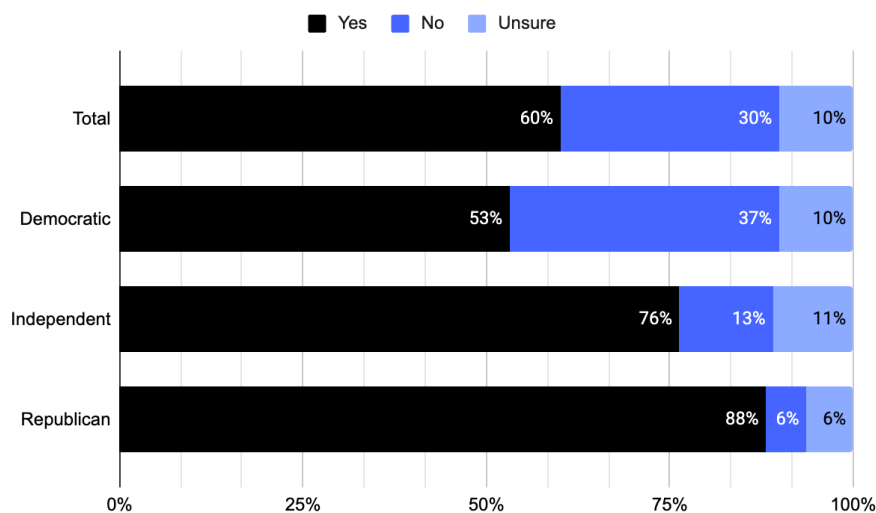
Approval

Two-thirds (66%) of registered voters disapprove of the job Mayor Katie Wilson is doing. Slightly over one in five (22%) approve, and 12% of registered voters are unsure. Wilson's strongest approval comes from just 28% of Seattle Democrats.



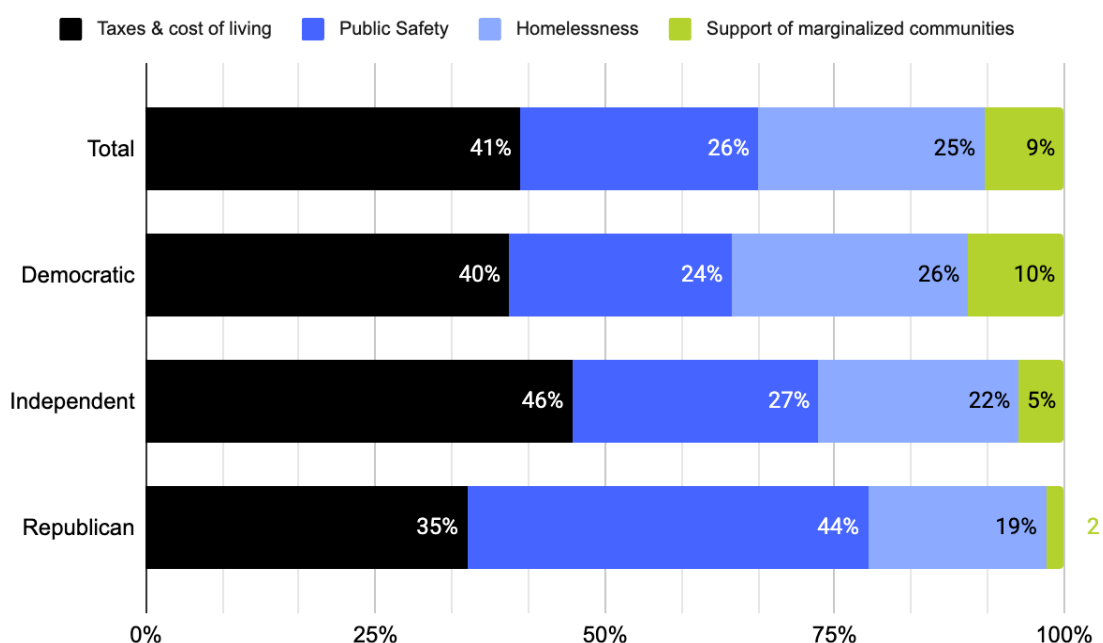
Removal

Six in ten (60%) believe Mayor Wilson should resign or be removed from office, with 30% saying no, and 10% saying they are unsure. Slightly over half of Seattle Democrats (53%) respond affirmatively to the question if she should resign or be removed from office.



Most Important Issue

When asked what the most important issue facing Seattle is, 41% of registered voters say it is taxes & cost of living, with nearly equal proportions saying it is public safety (26%) or homelessness (25%). Only 9% say the most important issue facing Seattle is support of marginalized communities, a massive misalignment between Seattle voters and the primary policy focus of Mayor Wilson.



Methodology: From August 13th to 17th, Iron Light polled 452 registered voters in Seattle via SMS survey. Respondents were drawn in a stratified random sample from the L2 voter file on cell phone availability, with survey invitations balanced by age, modeled party, and gender. Data was weighted to reflect the Seattle voter file distribution by race/ethnicity, education, and party registration.
